

FORMAL POTAGER




If your landscape allows for a total garden area that's more than 400 square feet, you have space to create what we call, a Formal Potager. Potagers go well beyond a few raised gardens and include additional features such as fountains, fruit trees, seating areas, and more. Potagers include garden beds with unique angles and curves and the gardens work together to create something of a maze or enclosure.

STUCCO

Stucco and wood kitchen gardens were created to fit perfectly within this courtyard space of a client's Spanish Colonial home. Large rectangular pavers allow for ease of movement around the garden while mondo grass softens the hardscape. Custom metal trellises mimic the exact arch of the home. These gardens provide over 250 square feet of growing space providing fresh herbs and seasonal vegetables.











CORTEN STEEL

Steel gardens make the most of your space by taking up a very small footprint. This means more garden space! In this space, four L shaped gardens were designed to coordinate with the color palette of the home. Accents include stepping stones to provide ease and comfort while moving in the space. They also give the eye a break amongst the gravel space. Finally, the fully functional garden fountain allowed this space to become a true garden retreat!









STEEL POWDER COATED

Dark powder coated steel gardens in a formal potager design provide over 150 square feet of growing space in this large backyard. The dark contrasting metal provides a contrast to the white exterior and coordinates with other exterior features such as windows and lighting. Mature olive trees and contemporary arch trellises complete this ultra modern kitchen garden.










This formal potager was built with untreated cedar and adds over 250 square feet of growing space to this modern backyard. With oversized arch trellises anda central bed for growing mint and other herbs, this garden provides many wonderful harvests.



FOUR GARDEN CLASSIC



If you have a space that's square, or nearly square, in shape and at least 15 feet wide (4.6 m), a four-garden classic is our favorite option. Functionally, four distinct gardens give you the option of separating crops and plants more methodically. And aesthetically, four gardens are absolute perfection in terms of kitchen garden design.

BRICK + STONE


This brick and stone garden was designed to match the slurried brick on the home. Coordinating brick caps and edging match the walkway to the front door.

These are square gardens measuring 4'x4' and are 2' tall giving a total growing space of 64 square feet. Placing them in front of the kitchen window allows for a gorgeous view all year round.









POWDER COATED STEEL

Powder coated steel gardens provide a uniform and consistent color that can coordinate with a home's windows, trim, gate or any other feature. The gardens featured here provide a modern aesthetic to the home and provide a beautiful contrast to the white brick in the background.







WEATHERED STEEL

These weathered steel gardens were the perfect addition to the pool and outdoor kitchen space. Four rectangular gardens measuring 8' x 3' x 2' to create a beautiful garden with a view.









This design takes the Four Garden Classic and lines the beds up along the fence line to ensure lots of growing space while also preserving plenty of lawn for everyday play.















This Classic Four Garden design has an added narrow rectangular bed at the end of the walkway. This is perfect space for a single vegetable variety such as carrots or as a pollinator or flower cutting garden. The stepping stones allow for comfortability of walking in the garden barefoot without the rough feel of gravel underfoot.















This cedar, four garden classic design consists of four 8' x 4' x 2' gardens for over 100 feet of growing space. The modern arch trellises blend a classic and modern feel to the space and the stepping stones provide ease and comfort in the garden.

KEYHOLE




Keyhole kitchen gardens are one of the best layouts for growing herbs, fruits, and vegetables. Keyhole gardens maximize the amount of space available for growing because the design uses nearly all of the available space while also creating a unique enclosed setup that's so fun to tend.



BRICK

Brick gardens are built to stand the test of time. The space is large, and a keyhole design allows access from each side and in the middle. These gardens provide 200 feet of growing space and a lovely view on the way into the home.





WEATHERED STEEL

Placing this beautiful weathered steel garden outside the home's window seemed like an easy choice. This unused space worked beautifully for a keyhole garden along with an additional center bed utilized for seasonal flowers or more herbs and vegetables! The simple, square obelisk trellises are placed to not block the view of the kitchen garden while providing vertical growing space.









STAINED CEDAR

This cedar garden was stained to match the fence, providing a cohesive and uniform look in the area. This space provides approximately 75 square feet in a space that is approximately 125 feet of garden space. The panel trellises completed the space and were the perfect contrast against the fence.





This garden space is a perfect example of maximizing all the space with a keyhole garden. This keyhole garden fits into a space that is approximately 10' feet x 10' feet and provides 65 feet of garden space. The handmade cedar trellises on three sides are perfect for tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and peas.



GARDEN TRIO



When a space is very long or more circular, creating a garden in a group of three is a great way to maximize the space. If your garden space is longer than it is wide, or if it's more circular and curved, a garden trio may be a perfect solution.







STACKED STONE

This stone garden trio design provides over 150 square feet of growing space. The garden beds create a space that will last forever and provide a wonderful retreat or thinking space. Obelisk trellises adorn the space for beauty and function.


CORTEN STEEL

This unique garden trio design mimics the curves of the space and coordinates with the pool shape. The brown hues of the raised gardens bring out the browns in the landscape border. The trellises are a focal point of the space while providing additional vertical space for tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and peas.









This garden cedar trio was the perfect use of this grassy space between the home and fence area. Three beds maximize the rectangular shape and provide for almost 100 square feet of growing space.





This garden trio is perfect for growing many harvests of herbs, vegetables and flowers in this rectangular space behind the home. Each bed is '8'x4'x2' giving a total of 96 square feet of growing space. The stepping stones provide ease and comfort within the space and the obelisk and panel trellises provide plenty of vertical growing space for tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and peas.

TWIN GARDEN



If you've got space and can dedicate some of your central lawn to a kitchen garden, twin gardens can be a perfect match. Twin gardens allow you to grow a wider variety of plants and the design works well in the landscape. Twin gardens provide a symmetrical layout that makes the most of a yard that's deeper than it is wide (or wider than it is deep). Twin gardens also allow you to maximize the growing space inside this larger garden area while creating more interest and appeal than a single garden provides.

CORTEN STEEL

These twin Corten large semi-circle beds keep with the curved landscape areas surrounding the gardens within the backyard. The addition of two arch trellises add a focal point and a secret garden feeling as you walk between the garden beds.










CORTEN STEEL

Front yard gardens are a wonderful way to add in an edible growing space. In this sunny space, beautiful Corten twin garden beds became part of the front landscape. The extra sun in the front is a key ingredient for the tomato plants growing over the arch trellis.






















POWDER COATED STEEL

Twin powder coated steel gardens were designed to coordinate with the trim and window color of the home and provide a perfect accent with the home's brick. These beds are approximately 3' x 6' for 36 square feet of growing space and two arches to provide additional growing space.









CEDAR

These twin gardens measure 10' x 4' for 80 square feet of garden space. The final touch is this modern steel trellis perfect for vining vegetables such as tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and peas.











The twin gardens featured here are adorned with an accent brick border and brick stepping stones down the center of the garden for ease and comfort within the garden space. The custom made Nicole Arch Trellis completes the space.





BORDER GARDEN




A border garden layout works well if you're limited in space, or you'd like to preserve most of your lawn or landscape for other uses. Great places for border gardens include: along the house, in side yards, along fences and driveways, and along the backyard's perimeter.



STONE

A centrally positioned brick garden is an extension of the home. This garden is slurried to match the home and measures 12' long x 4' wide x 2' tall for 48 square feet of garden space. This space is part shade so is filled with greens and herbs that can thrive in lower light gardens.



STACKED STONE


This stacked stone garden is an elegant contrast to the stucco home. This square shaped garden is approximately 5' wide x 5' long and 1' tall. The antique obelisk trellises complete the space.

POWDER COATED STEEL

This blank brick wall was just waiting for a garden. Three powder coated gardens measuring 6' long x 2.5' wide x 2' high were placed between the pool and the brick wall. A large accent piece is needed to complete this space so custom trellises provide both a focal point and vertical growing space for the garden.












POWDER COATED STEEL

These powder coated kitchen gardens fit great in small spaces and maximize the growing potential. One garden seen here shows what's possible in a small space as it's 12' long and 3' wide. In addition to plenty of herbs and flowers this garden also includes 12 large vegetable plants such as kale, eggplant or tomatoes, 24 medium plants such as peppers chard, cilantro or dill and 40 small plants or seeds such as arugula or lettuce. Three obelisk trellises complete the design and provide ample growing space for vining vegetables such as tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and peas.



WEATHERED STEEL

Weathered steel gardens provide both durability and a unique look to a client's kitchen garden space. This border garden fits perfectly along the clients driveway and measures 8' long x 2' wide x 2' tall for 16 feet of growing space. Three panel trellises provide a beautiful backdrop against the cedar fence.



CORTEN

Weathered steel gardens provide both durability and a unique look to this kitchen garden space. This border garden fits perfectly along the driveway and measures 8' long x 2' wide x 2' tall for 16 feet of growing space. Three panel trellises provide a beautiful backdrop against the cedar fence.











STAINED CEDAR

These two gardens show how a stained cedar garden can be created to coordinate with an existing fence or home color. Up top, you can see a border garden in an L shape design to keep room for outdoor dining and below, a 14' x 2' border garden that provides 28 square feet of growing space right next to the family pool. This border garden is 14' x 2' and provides 28' square feet of growing space. The three panel trellises allow for plenty of growing space for tomatoes or cucumbers and space in the front for up to 14 medium plants and up to 56 small plants.




